

# Uzbekistan

The country gained its independence from the former Soviet Union in 1991, but to date no meter stamp with frank naming the capital of the country has come to our attention. One provisional stamp with country identity derived from the slogan and town mark is all we have so far.

1 1996 or earlier, Perm (MV). A provisional stamp based on a USSR Group D die. Upright octagon with double straight line outer border. Possibly with an inner square border around the value figures. Blank, or possibly with a logo of some sort at top, and "ПОЧТА" at bottom. Can be identified as from Uzbekistan by the town mark and slogan which identify the country's capital, Tashkent. TM: DC with inner circle flat at top and bottom.
